The Senate met at 1:18 p.m. pursuant to adjournment and was called to order by the President.

Pursuant to Section 2116.003, Texas Government Code, the Texas Bullion Depository is "administered as a division of the office of the comptroller and under the direction and supervision of a bullion depository administrator appointed by the comptroller."

Today I am appointing Tom Smelker as Administrator of the Texas Bullion Depository. Tom is currently the Director of Treasury Operations for the Comptroller's office. He has nearly 30 years of experience with the state treasury and is responsible for designing and administering many of the programs and systems our treasury relies upon today. Tom has worked on the bullion depository legislation since the iteration of the proposal from the 83rd Legislative Session. As the Depository Administrator, Tom will administer, supervise, and direct the operations and affairs of the depository and depository agents.

SENATE BILL 20 ON SECOND READING

The President laid before the Senate **SB 20** by Senator Taylor of Collin at this time on its second reading:

SB 20, Relating to the continuation and sunset review of certain governmental entities subject to abolishment on September 1, 2017.

The bill was read second time.

Senator Taylor of Collin offered the following amendment to the bill:

Floor Amendment No. 1

Amend SB 20 (senate committee printing) as follows:

(1) In the caption to the bill, strike "the continuation and sunset review of certain governmental entities subject to abolishment" and substitute "avoiding the abolishment of certain agencies subject to the Texas Sunset Act".

(2) Strike Section 6 of the bill, adding Section 325.0128, Government Code.

(3) Renumber the SECTIONS of the bill accordingly.

The amendment to SB 20 was read and was adopted by a viva voce vote.

All Members are deemed to have voted "Yea" on the adoption of Floor Amendment No. 1.

SB 20 as amended was passed to engrossment by the following vote: Yeas 31, Nays 0.

SENATE BILL 60 ON SECOND READING

The President laid before the Senate **SB 60** by Senator Taylor of Collin at this time on its second reading:

SB 60, Relating to the repeal of certain riders for the Texas Medical Board and the Texas State Board of Examiners of Psychologists from the General Appropriations Act that are contingent upon the approval of certain Acts continuing those agencies during the 85th Regular Session.

The bill was read second time and was passed to engrossment by the following vote: Yeas 31, Nays 0.
