STATEMENT OF LEGISLATIVE INTENT

Senator Creighton submitted the following statement of legislative intent for **SB 1405**:

SB 1405 applies only to a public sale of residential real property conducted under a power of sale in a security instrument. The definition of security instrument in the bill is taken from Chapter 51 of the Property Code, which defines "Security instrument" to mean "a deed of trust, mortgage, or other contract lien on an interest in real property."

It is not the intent of SB 1405 to apply to the enforcement of such assessment liens by property owner's associations that arise as servitudes under dedicatory instrument, which are comprehensively regulated under Chapter 209, Property Code.

Such liens are not "contractual liens" in the sense intended by the definition of "security instrument" in Chapter 51, Property Code.
